REQUIRED EQUIPMENT

Mask, snorkel, fins, appropriate exposure protection, weight system, BCD w/ low pressure inflator, regulator w/ pressure gauge, depth gauge and timer (or dive computer), alternate air source, compass, dive knife, log book, whistle, DSMB, slate, PADI RDP (table & e-RDP). Equipment must be modern and in good repair.
